

SCIENTIFIC WORD TIPS... June 2014

You can customize any shell you are working in with Latex "insert-adjustment" commands. Hit the TEX button and open a page; type in the Latex command that will then go into your Sci Word document.

Some simple, useful customizations commands to insert:

(1) space between lines, change numerical value around 1.0

..... `\baselineskip=1.2\baselineskip`

(2) start a chapter somewhere in say a book shell, with heading "Once Upon a Time"

.... `\chapter{Once Upon a Time}`

(3) move footnotes to end of document (type footnotes as usual in the text)

.... `\setcounter{endnote}{0}` gets placed at beginning of document

and `\theendnotes` gets placed at the end in the place you want the footnotes to commence, or for starting the end footnotes at a new page at the end, then

.... `\newpage`
`\begingroup`
`\theendnotes`
`\endgroup`
